Film is so much more than a blockbuster-churning, financial machine. Whilst the industry is financially booming and, in the UK alone, has become a billion-pound economic machine, film is, at its heart, an expression of art.

How do the creatives and filmmakers input meaning into their film? How are audiences expected to decode them? What political, social, technological contexts have influenced the messages that are put into film? How has cinema changed over the years since its invention in the 1890s? In A Level Film Studies, we'll be exploring all of these points, and more, as we form an appreciation for all the forms that film and cinema can take.

This course will develop your analytical skills, cultural appreciation, technical knowledge, and critical thinking skills. Whether you're a cinema buff, or if you've only got a foundational interest in film you want to expand upon, Film Studies will help your knowledge and appreciation of cinema flourish.

Units of study will include:

- Mainstream and independent American film
- Classical and New Hollywood
- British cinema since 1995
- Global cinema, European and non-European
- Documentary film
- Silent cinema
- Experimental cinema
- Coursework, where you'll have the opportunity to create your own 5 minute short film

This enrolment task will allow you to engage with films artistically before you join us. I'd also recommend logging your film-watching habits and reviewing films on apps and websites such as **Letterboxd** to encourage your own engagement.
